Proof of identification / photo ID must be provided before a ballot may be issued.

Why can't | bring latex paint?

Latex paint is not considered to be a hazardous material. It can be disposed by putting it in the trash.

The recommended method for disposal is to put kitty litter in a box, spread the paint over the litter and allow to dry, then dispose of it with your garbage.

There are also paint hardeners that can be purchased at a hardware store.

SAG

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- M Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
-))) Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- » Never leave your grill unattended.
- Mail Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
-))) If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- M Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

Birchwood Grill

Birchwood Grill—officially Birchwood Grill Northwoods Eatery & Bar—is located just west of Highway 94 on the southeast corner of 125th Avenue and State Trunk Highway 50. It's an area that looks poised for development, with some already underway, but Birchwood Grill appears to be part of the old guard. In fact, the restaurant just celebrated its 20th anniversary last month. It was opened—and is still owned today—by Louis and Krystyna Tricoli. When the Tricolis took ownership of the building in the fall of 2003, they did some quick remodeling; the building reminded Louis of a northwoods cabin, so he gave his new restaurant a northwoods theme.

Birchwood Grill is a family-ran, upbeat restaurant that offers an award-winning Salad Bar, Daily Buffets and a diverse sit down menu. inspections in accordance with Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter PSC 185 and NR 810.15. Village employees will have ID Badges and will be driving a Village of Bristol vehicle. Calibrations and inspections usually take less than 30 minutes.

This process takes place every 10 years. Water meters are calibrated or replaced and cross connection inspections are done to protect the customer and the water system. Some of the items inspected are sump pumps, water softener drains, and hose bibbs. Customers due for calibration will receive the first notification by mail. Any questions please call 262-857-9371

346.28: Pedestrians to walk on left side of highway; pedestrians, bicyclists, and riders of electric personal assistive mobility devices on sidewalks. (1) Any pedestrian traveling along and upon a highway other than upon a sidewalk shall travel on and along the left side of the highway and upon meeting a vehicle shall, if practicable, move to the extreme outer limit of the traveled portion of the highway. (2) Operators of vehicles shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, bicyclists, and riders of electric personal assistive mobility devices on sidewalks as required by s. 346.47.

*Payments can be made at the village office during office hours or can be placed in the drop box located by the front entrance doors. If you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

BURN PERMITS (payments not available online)

Outdoor fires require a burn permit which is valid January-December. Please call the Fire Department Burn Line at 857-4063 for the current burn status just prior to burning. Permits can be purchased at the Village Hall during regular business hours or at the Fire Department nights and weekends. First time permits are \$25, and renewals are \$15.

BUILDING PERMITS

If you are doing any type of home renovations, please visit our website and complete a *building permit application*. A *zoning permit* is also required in addition to the building permit if you are building a garage, shed, fence, accessory building, or adding on to a building.

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS at the Village Office

The Village of Bristol accepts credit/debit card payments *in the village office* for anything payable to the village. There is a convenience fee of 2.79%.

ONLINE PAYMENTS ARE AVAILABLE!

Payments can be made online for: sewer/water bills, taxes, invoices payable to the village, traffic citations, and building permits. There is a 2.79% convenience fee if paying with a debit or credit card, or a \$0.75 fee if paying by e-check. Visit our website at VillageofBristol.org to make your payments.
