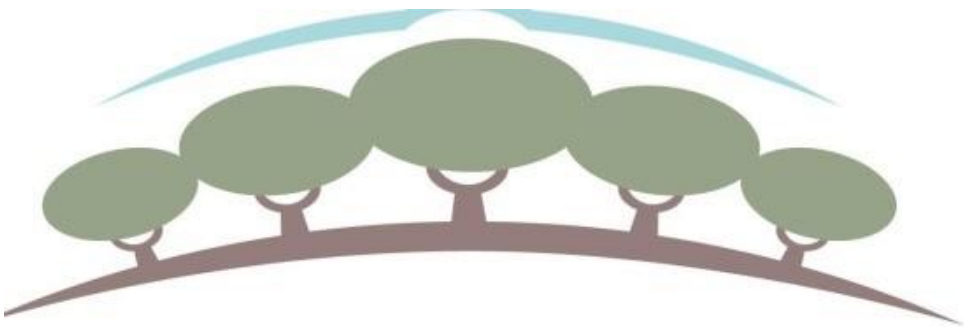

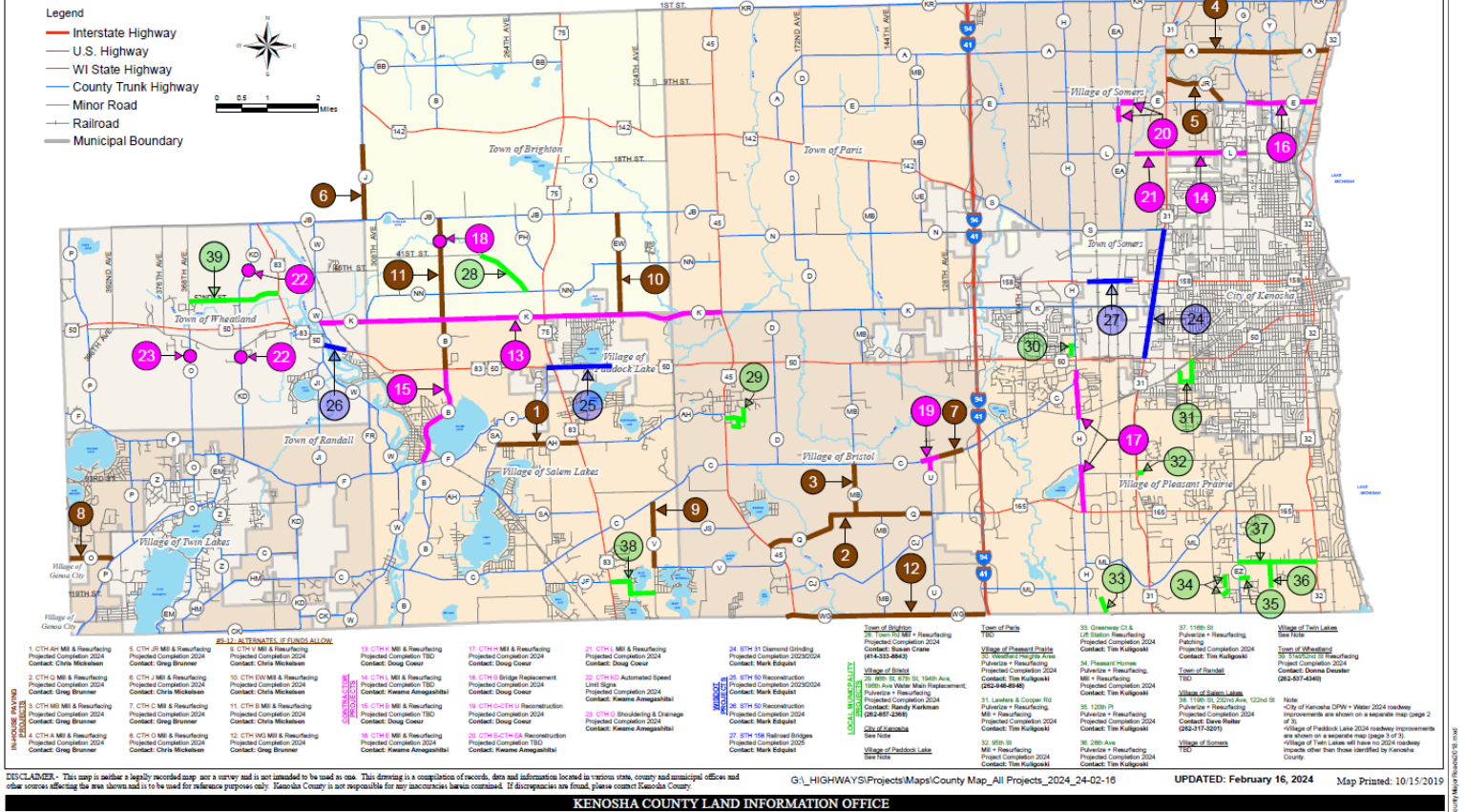
Kenosha County Highway Projects Map

ATV/UTV Ordinance Update:

On March 11th, the Village Board approved the use of all-terrain vehicles (ATV) and utility terrain vehicles (UTV) on Village owned streets only. Next steps for implementation are:

- The Village will update the map and send it to the DNR for approval.
- Get approval from the Wisconsin DOT for signs to educate the public about the allowed use on village owned streets.

There is no fee for the collection of any hazardous waste or E-waste material at this event.

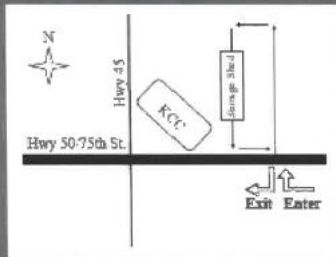
All Kenosha County residents are eligible to participate!

Proper handling of household hazardous waste

- Keep products in original containers.
- Place it in a leak-proof container.
- Do not mix products together.
- Pack containers in sturdy boxes in the trunk or in the rear of your vehicle.
- Store products away from kids, pets and fire.

Why can't I bring latex paint?

Latex paint is not considered to be a hazardous material. It can be disposed by putting it in the trash.

The recommended method for disposal is to put kitty litter in a box, spread the paint over the litter and allow to dry, then dispose of it with your garbage.

There are also paint hardeners that can be purchased at a hardware store.

It provides valuable information for elderly adults who are at higher risk of credit card fraud due to limited experience with devices, greater wealth accumulation, and potential cognitive degeneration.

Our guide also includes these statistics that your readers may find interesting:

1. **80% of U.S. credit cards currently in circulation have been compromised** in some way
2. **Baby boomers** born between 1946 and 1964 are most susceptible to credit fraud, comprising **42.6% of the victims**.
3. An estimated **\$165.1 billion will be lost to fraud in the U.S. alone across the next 10 years**.

Vacations and business travel make hotels and motels our home away from home. It is just as important to be prepared and know what you would do in a hotel/motel emergency as it is in your own home.

BE SAFE WHEN TRAVELING!

- Choose a hotel/motel that is protected by both smoke alarms and a fire sprinkler system.
- When you check in, ask the front desk what the fire alarm sounds like.
- When you enter your room, review the escape plan posted in your room.
- Take the time to find the exits and count the number of doors between your room and the exit. Make sure the exits are unlocked. If they are locked, report it to management right away.
- Keep your room key by your bed and take it with you if there is a fire.
- If the alarm sounds, leave right away, closing all doors behind you. Use the stairs — never use elevators during a fire.
- If you must escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your exit.

If You Can't Escape...

SHUT off fans and air conditioners.

STUFF wet towels in the crack around the doors.

CALL the fire department and let them know your location.

WAIT at the window and signal with a flashlight or light colored cloth.

FACTS

- ! On average, one of every **14 hotels** or motels reported a structure fire each year.
- ! The majority of hotel fire deaths result from fires that started in the **bedroom**.
- ! **Cooking** is the leading cause of hotel/motel fires.

Escape Planning

Plan Ahead! If a fire breaks out in your home, you may have only a few minutes to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if there is a fire.



SAFETY TIPS

- » **MAKE** a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your home.
- » **KNOW** at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- » **HAVE** an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- » **PRACTICE** your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.
- » **PRACTICE** using different ways out.
- » **TEACH** children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- » **CLOSE** doors behind you as you leave.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- » If the smoke alarm sounds, **GET OUT AND STAY OUT**. Never go back inside for people or pets.
- » If you have to escape through smoke, **GET LOW AND GO** under the smoke to your way out.
- » **CALL** the fire department from outside your home.

FACTS

- ! A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire. Install smoke alarms inside every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- ! According to an NFPA survey, only **one of every three** American households have actually developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.
- ! While **71%** of Americans have an escape plan in case of a fire, only **47%** of those have practiced it.
- ! **One-third** of American households who made an estimate thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life-threatening. The time available is often less. And only **8%** said their first thought on hearing a smoke alarm would be to get out!

Dog License Renewal Reminder

All dogs 6 months old and older are required to be registered with the Village of Bristol and Kenosha County. Registration helps locate lost dogs. To register and purchase your dog tags/license, bring your dog's most recent rabies vaccination report to the Village Hall building. License renewals are due by March 31st and are good for the calendar year.

Fees:

Spayed or Neutered dogs = \$5 each

Intact dogs = \$11 each

Late fee for fees paid after March 31st = \$5

The garbage (brown cart) is emptied on a weekly basis. The recycling (green cart) is emptied every other week and not emptied by the bulk collection crews. Large items, extra cans or bags can be taken with the bulk collections. Construction materials and electronics are not included in bulk collection.

Please place all materials out the night before or by 6 a.m. on your day of service.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Please visit our website villageofbristol.org to make the following types of payments (except Burn Permits):

*Payments can be made at the village office during office hours or can be placed in the drop box located by the front entrance doors. If you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

BURN PERMITS (*payments not available online*)

Outdoor fires require a burn permit which is valid January-December. Please call the Fire Department Burn Line at [857-4063](tel:857-4063) for the current burn status just prior to burning. Permits can be purchased at the Village Hall during regular business hours or at the Fire Department nights and weekends. First time permits are \$25, and renewals are \$15.

BUILDING PERMITS

If you are doing any type of home renovations, please visit our website and complete a [building permit application](#). A [zoning permit](#) is also required in addition to the building permit if you are building a garage, shed, fence, accessory building, or adding on to a building.

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS at the Village Office

The Village of Bristol accepts credit/debit card payments [in the village office](#) for anything payable to the village. There is a convenience fee of 3%.

ONLINE PAYMENTS ARE AVAILABLE!

Payments can be made online for: sewer/water bills, taxes, invoices payable to the village, traffic citations, and building permits. There is a 2.75% convenience fee if paying with a debit or credit card, or a \$0.75 fee if paying by e-check. Visit our website to make your payments.

RECYCLING CENTER

Accepts: brush, grass, leaves, cooking oil, waste oil, anti-freeze, scrap steel.

Monday-Friday: 7am-3pm

Additional Hours: April-Nov: 1st & 3rd Wed. 3pm-6pm, and 1st & 3rd Sat. 9am-noon.

Dec-March: 1st Sat 9am-noon
