## Streets To Be Closed for Slurry Sealing

The Village of Bristol has contracted with Struck and Irwin Paving Inc. to perform slurry sealing for the Village during the 2011 construction season. The Village of Bristol has considered approval of the slurry sealing during its regular June 27<sup>th</sup> 2011 board meeting. Roads to be slurry sealed are:

Lake Shangri - La 214<sup>th</sup> Avenue and east of 214<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

Nelson's Subdivision north of Hwy C.

195<sup>th</sup> Avenue north of 83<sup>rd</sup> Street.

176<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 91<sup>st</sup> Place north of Hwy C.

201<sup>st</sup>, 202<sup>nd</sup> and 203<sup>rd</sup> Avenue along with 82<sup>nd</sup> and 83<sup>rd</sup> Street near the Bristol Grade School.

If your street is among those scheduled, it will be closed to all traffic for most of the day while the slurry is applied and for the duration of the curing time. At least one day prior to the street closing, you will receive a blue flyer from the contractor detailing the scope of the work and the exact date your street will be closed.

**Each road will experience temporary closures for the full day to ensure the slurry seal sets properly. Please refrain from parking on the streets as this will only delay the process.**

Slurry seal is a cost effective treatment that prolongs the life of the streets by reducing deterioration caused by weathering. The slurry seal process consists of applying a mixture of liquid asphalt and fine aggregate onto the pavement with a slurry machine. Driving on the slurry seal before the slurry seal has set up and before the traffic control signs have been removed, might damage your vehicle's paint finish and might cause tracking of tar onto your driveway. During the first week following the placement of the slurry seal, please try to avoid turning your vehicle sharply since doing so will scar the surface of the slurry seal. Main cracks in the streets will be sealed and depressional cracked areas may be spray coated prior to the seal coat.

Many people schedule to go visit someone, visit a park, out to eat or shopping after work the day of the slurry seal project. This extra time will help out with the curing time required.

The Village of Bristol apologizes in advance for any inconvenience this work may cause and thanks you for your cooperation with the contractor.

## 2011 Summer Public Safety News

With summer finally here, the Public Safety Dept. would like to remind you of a couple of important ordinances that have been an issue the past couple of years.

**Ordinance 8-1-3 Destruction of Noxious Weeds:** The Village would like to remind its property owners of their responsibility to destroy noxious weeds. Weeds such as Canadian Thistles and Creeping Jenny are examples of Noxious Weeds and must be destroyed by the property owner. This not only violates Village ordinances (8-1-3) but also Wisconsin Statute 66.0407.

**Ordinance 8-1-4 Regulation of Length of Lawn and Grasses:** All lots other than agriculture and open conservation zoned areas maintain their grassy areas so they do not exceed 8 inches in height because it adversely affects the public's health and safety.

**Ordinance 8-3-6 Collection Schedules:** Any bulk waste material and/or garbage and recycling totes cannot be placed curbside before 4 pm on the afternoon before pickup and they must be removed by 8 pm the day of pickup.

Televisions and computers are no longer accepted into landfills and John's Disposal will not pick these items up.

**Ordinance 8-3-7 Illegal Dumping or Rummaging:** It shall be unlawful for anyone to rummage through bulky waste and materials along the roadside unless acting with proper permission or authority.

(We have recently had an issue of private scrappers coming through neighborhoods in the Village looking for recyclable materials so they can privately benefit themselves. Residents are asked if they see any scrapper other than John's Disposal coming through the neighborhood to write down the license plate number and vehicle description and turn this in to the Sheriff's Department or Department of Public Safety).

## Fireworks Prohibited in the Village—Ordinance 7-5-1

The sale of fireworks or the possession of fireworks with intent to sell within the Village of Bristol is hereby prohibited. "Fireworks" means anything manufactured, processed or packaged for exploding, emitting sparks or combustion which does not have another common use.

### Always Remember to...

Get your burn permit if you have not done so already. Initial permit is \$25 and to renew your permit is \$15. You must also remember to follow the guidelines that are on the permit as conditions can change during the day. And, "Be kind to your neighbors when burning."

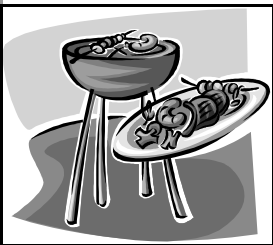
Have a Carbon Monoxide (CO) detector in your residence in the sleeping area. CO is a colorless, odorless gas that can kill you if there is a problem with gas appliances or the chimney flue is blocked.

Check your smoke detectors on a monthly basis and practice Exit Drills with a predetermined meeting place outside your residence.

## Be safe when using your grill

To ensure safe cookouts, make sure someone tends the grill at all times. Here are some grilling safety tips to consider:

- Keep grills away from combustibles, including the outside of your house, balcony or garage.
- Check hose integrity and hose connections to make sure gas is not leaking from your gas grill. Apply soapy water to hoses and connections to reveal any leaks.
- Follow the manufacturers' instructions on how to set up the grill and maintain it.
- Never store propane cylinders in buildings or garages. If you store a gas grill inside during the winter, disconnect the cylinder and leave it outside.
- Enforce a "kid-free zone" of 36" around the grill. Also keep your pets from underfoot.
- Never add charcoal starter fluid when coals or kindling have already been ignited, and never use any flammable or combustible liquid other than charcoal starter fluid to get the fire going.
- Keep the grill clean.
