Village News.....

The Village has received bids for pulverizing and paving 81st Street from 216th Avenue east to 82nd Street. Work is planned for this summer. There will be some undercutting (removal of spongy material and installing gravel) of soft areas required. Please give the contractors a break and limit your use of 81st street during the construction.



The Village will also receive bids to plant street trees around Bristol School. Street trees help reduce asphalt temperatures in the summer and add value year around. Seedlings will be given out to the Bristol School children at the Arbor Day Celebration. (Date to be determined)

The Village tries to hand out seedlings each year. We pick one tree to help educate the children on that specific tree for the year. The tree this year is the Black Cherry (*Prunus Serotina*). It is a native tree that grows quickly and reaches 60-80 feet tall and around 30 ft wide and can live as much as 150 years. The reddish Black Cherry is edible although quite acidic. This tree can grow in many different soil conditions and the wood can be very valuable.

Winter Blast!!

Winter storms can range from a moderate snow over a few hours to a blizzard with blinding, wind-driven snow that lasts for several days. Some winter storms are large enough to affect several states, while others affect only a single community. Many winter storms are accompanied by dangerously low temperatures and sometimes by strong winds, icing, sleet and freezing rain.

Regardless of the severity of a winter storm, you should be prepared in order to remain safe during these events.

Know the Difference...

Winter Storm Outlook - Winter storm conditions are possible in the next 2 to 5 days.

Winter Weather Advisory - Winter weather conditions are expected to cause significant inconveniences and may be hazardous. When caution is used, these situations should not be life threatening.

Winter Storm Watch - Winter storm conditions are possible within the next 36 to 48 hours. People in a watch area should review their winter storm plans and stay informed about weather conditions.

Winter Storm Warning - Life-threatening, severe winter conditions have begun or will begin within 24 hours. People in a warning area should take precautions immediately.

Public Works Reminder

DO NOT plow your snow into the road or push it across the road.
The Village has an ordinance prohibiting this and you could be ticketed for it.
Sidewalks must also be shoveled within 24 hours of the last snowfall.

Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Symptoms

Because carbon monoxide is odorless and colorless it is not always evident when it has become a problem in the home. Often people who have a mild to moderate problem will find they feel sick while they spend time at home. They might feel a little better outside in the fresh air but will have re-occurring symptoms shortly after returning home. If other members of the family have re-occurring bouts with flu-like symptoms while fuel burning appliances are being used it may be time to have the house checked by a professional.

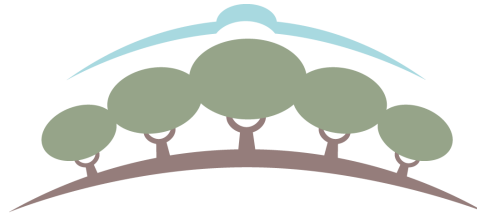


Bristol History Mystery
