# Spring Primary Election is February 16th.

On February 16th, 2016 there will be a Spring Primary Election for Supreme Court Justice. Sample ballots can be viewed in the outside display case at the Village Hall.

The Government Accountability Board has also announced that Voter ID is required.

Below is a list of acceptable photo ID's:

WI Driver License or State ID
WI Driver or State Receipt
US Passport
University/College ID
Tribal ID
US Uniformed Services
Certificate of Naturalization

Before you vote you need to be registered to vote. You can register on the same day as the election. The polls are open from 7:00am to 8:00pm.

We Wisconsinites are blessed this year with four, yes FOUR, elections to have our votes counted so we can have a say in our local, state and national government. Voting does matter and every vote is important. Put these dates on your calendar:

- February 16th, Supreme Court Justice.
- April 5th, local (municipal & school), Supreme Court Justice AND Presidential Preference Primary.
- August 9th, Partisan Primary for Congress and State Legislature.
- November 8th , General Election for President, State Legislature and Congress.



### SNOW...Wonderful SNOW...

Please don't plow snow from driveways into the streets or across the streets. This creates a hazard for traffic and pedestrians. It is also against the Village of Bristol Ordinance 6-3-3 Damage to or Obstruction of Streets. Place the majority of snow to the right side of your driveway (as you are looking into the street). This will reduce the amount of snow that gets

pushed back into your driveway when the Village or County plows the street. It also can be easier to deal with just clearing the driveway once.

The Sheriff deputies will be enforcing this ordinance in the future.

Shoveling snow can be a big workout. Consider any health risks before you head out to tackle the snow.

- If you are out of shape, have back problems, or heart conditions, it may actually be dangerous for you to shovel snow. After a snowfall, hospitals are inundated with heart attack victims and patients with wrenched backs.
- Dress appropriately. You need to dress warmly, but not so warmly that you are sweating
  heavily after several minutes of work. Dress in light layers that are easy to remove and do not
  restrict your movement. Wear gloves that will prevent blisters and keep your hands warm and
  dry.
- You lose a large amount of body heat through your head. Wear a hat to retain that body heat and keep yourself warm. If it is very cold you may consider breathing through a scarf.
- Start early in the day. Fresh snow weighs less than older snow so you should clear snow as soon as it has fallen. As snow sits on the ground it compacts and becomes wet, making it heavier. One shovelful of snow can weigh 20 pounds! It can also then turn into ice and become very difficult to remove.
- Wait until the snowplow has come by before finishing the driveway. A snowplow will usually "plow in" the driveway at least a bit, pushing more snow onto the edge of your driveway.
